The following position for a Sessional Lecturer is available in the Department of Philosophy for the Spring 2021 academic session. This is a regular posting in accordance with the Collective Agreement between The Governing Council of the University of Toronto and the Canadian Union of Public Employees, Local 3902 Unit 3. **Please note that the position below is tentative, pending final course determinations and enrolments.** In accordance with the Collective Agreement, this posting is being sent as an email notification to all applicants in the Department’s Applicant Pool: all Sessional Lecturers who are teaching for the Department during the current academic year or who have taught for the Department since July 1, 2018 and all persons who have submitted an application within the past twenty-four months. All pool members who wish to be considered for a particular position must submit a CUPE 3902 application form, cover letter, and updated curriculum vitae to Eric Correia by e-mail to eric.correia@utoronto.ca. Preference in hiring will be given to qualified individuals advanced to the rank of Sessional Lecturer II or Sessional Lecturer III in accordance with Article 14:12.

Salary: in accordance with the current CUPE 3902 Unit 3 Collective Agreement, the rate of pay for Sessional Lecturer I will be **\$8,489.67** for a half course (F or S) inclusive of 4% vacation pay. Please note that should rates stated in the collective agreement vary from the rates stated in this posting, the rates stated in the collective agreement shall prevail.
