- Enrolled in the 3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> yr of an undergraduate philosophy major, specialist or joint specialist program on the St. George campus.

- Minimum A- average in philosophy courses preferred

**Duties:**

- Leading two tutorial groups (one hr each per week) and related preparation and activities.
- Grading of student work and related activities.
- Attending approximately half the lectures.
- Meeting with the Course Instructor/Socrates Project Facilitator as required.
- Attending T.A. training sessions in late August or early September
- Reasonable student contact hours.
