**Qualifications**

- Enrolled in the 3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> year of an undergraduate philosophy major, specialist, or joint specialist program on the St. George campus.
- Good prior knowledge of the subject matter of the course.
- Minimum A- average in philosophy courses preferred.

**Duties**

- Leading two tutorial groups (one hour each per week) and related preparation and activities.
- Grading of student work and related activities.

- Attending approximately half the lectures.
- Meeting with the Course Instructor/Socrates Project Facilitator as required.
- Attending T.A. training sessions (the first will be likely held between Sept. 1-4).
- Reasonable student contact hours.

Successful candidates will be required to enroll in PHL489Y1Y Advanced Topics in Philosophy: Socrates Project (for regular academic credit) as a condition of employment.

This course will be offered by the Department of Philosophy and is scheduled to meet Fridays, 12-3. The course is a research seminar which will complement the Socrates Project by providing a more in depth study of the philosophical topics introduced in PHL 100.
